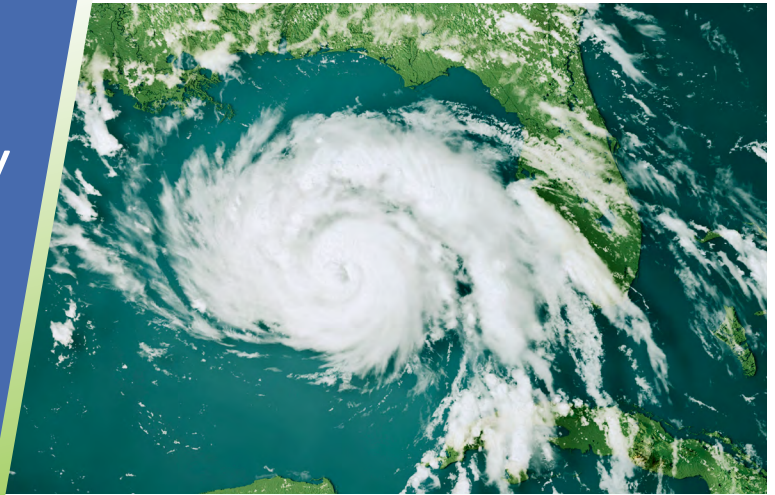


## Five tips for traveling safely during hurricane season

If you're planning to travel during hurricane season (June through November), then it's important to familiarize yourself with hurricane facts and safety tips before your trip.



### 1. Know when hurricane season occurs.

Plan your trip with hurricane safety in mind and be aware of the different hurricane seasons. The Atlantic and Eastern North Pacific hurricane seasons begin at different times.

- **Atlantic hurricane season:**  
June 1 through the end of November.
- **Eastern North Pacific hurricane season:**  
May 15 through the end of November.

### 2. Know where hurricanes occur.

Hurricanes can form in many areas, but you should use extreme caution if traveling to areas in the Atlantic basin, eastern Pacific, or western Pacific — or avoid traveling to these areas altogether during hurricane season.

### 3. Ask for hurricane safety procedures.

If your upcoming trip is in a hurricane-prone destination, reach out to your hotel or resort to request hurricane evacuation information.

Preparing a disaster kit to take with you on your vacation is also helpful. Items to include: a first aid kit, flashlight, extra clothing, canned food, and bottled water.

### 4. Consider cruises and alternate destinations.

Depending on the storm, most cruise liners may adjust the course and detour to different ports. Sometimes, this means you'll be safer at sea than on land.

If the possibility of a hurricane or significant storm doesn't align with your desired vacation, you may want to consider an alternative destination with a low likelihood of major storms.

### 5. Consider purchasing travel insurance.

Travellex's Ultimate plan provides coverage for trip cancellation, trip interruption, or travel delay resulting from a named hurricane.

Our **trip cancellation** and **trip interruption** benefits can provide coverage if:

- Your home is made uninhabitable or inaccessible by a hurricane.
- A hurricane causes the accommodation at your destination to be inaccessible or uninhabitable.<sup>1</sup>

Our **travel delay** benefit can provide coverage if:

- A common carrier causes your trip to be delayed for at least five consecutive hours.

**Please note:** Coverage does not apply — and claims will not be paid — if the disturbance becomes a named tropical storm or hurricane prior to the purchase of travel insurance or if losses occur more than 21 days after the hurricane makes your destination inaccessible.
